
# MAUNDY THURSDAY


**Welcome!** This evening begins a special time of unhurried meditation for Christians. You will note these features of today's Maundy Thursday service:

- **Closing of the Lenten season:** We finish the season of Lent with the sermon. The sermon comes first in this service.
- **Confession and Absolution:** Perhaps more than any other service in the year we focus on confessing our sins, and receiving God's forgiveness in Christ through our pastor. We anticipate His forgiveness also in the Lord's Supper.
- **The High Priestly Prayer:** An adaptation of Christ's High Priestly Prayer (John 17) in the Upper Room on Maundy Thursday evening will conclude with the Lord's Prayer.
- **The Lord's Supper:** This is the highpoint of the evening, when Christ instituted for all time His Holy Sacrament for our salvation, and commanded (Maundo) us to keep on doing this in remembrance of Him.
- **Christ's Command to Love Each Other:** Maundy is from the Latin word Maundo, which means "to command." One of the final commands Christ gave us before His departure is "Love one another as I have loved you." Love is a fruit of the Sacrament. We will sing a hymn based on Christ's words from John 15.
- **The Reading of Psalm 88:** As you hear the words of this psalm, imagine Jesus speaking them. This psalm reminds us how Christ was abandoned by His closest friends in the Garden of Gethsemane.
- **No Blessing at the End:** There is no blessing because our observance of Christ's Passion continues on Good Friday.

#### **OPENING HYMN**

The congregation will sing the verses marked "The Soul." The presider will sing the verses marked "Jesus."

#### INSTRUCTION FOR THE END OF LENT

m In this Lenten season we have heard again how our Lord walked the path of suffering, which led him to the cross for our salvation. We have also heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil — all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were committed at Baptism; God's forgiveness and the power of his Spirit to amend our lives continue with us because of his love for us in Jesus, our Savior.

Within the family of the Church, God never wearies of giving peace and new life. In the absolution we receive forgiveness as from God himself. This absolution we should not doubt, but firmly believe that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven, for it comes to us in the name and by the command of our Lord.

We who receive God's love in Jesus Christ are called to love one another, to be servants to each other, as Jesus became our servant.

In Holy Communion the members of Christ's body participate most intimately in his love. Remembering our Lord's last supper with his disciples, we eat the bread and drink the cup of this meal. Together we receive the Lord's gift of his body and blood for forgiveness and participate in that new covenant that makes us one with him and one another. The Lord's Supper is the promise of the great banquet we will share with all the faithful when our Lord returns, the joyous culmination of our reconciliation with God and each other.

#### **CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION**

m Let us confess our sins to God and ask for his forgiveness.

Please stand

C Almighty God, merciful Father, I confess to you that I have not loved you with all my heart. In what I have done and left undone, I have pursued my ways instead of your ways. I have not loved my brothers and sisters as myself. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

I am truly sorry for my sins. I repent of them. I beg for your mercy, O Lord.

Silence for meditation

Forgive us for the sake of Jesus Christ who suffered and died for us.

Cleanse me from my sins. Release me from my guilt. Grant me your Holy Spirit to amend my sinful life.

The almighty God has been merciful to us and has sent his Son to die for all. For his sake, God forgives our sins and calls us from darkness to his marvelous light. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.

#### Amen.

#### **EXHORTATION**

Our Lord Jesus Christ has forgiven us and reconciled us to God and has promised us the power to forgive and love each other. Relying on his promise, therefore, be reconciled with one another.

Brothers and sisters, may the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, in our words, and in our actions toward each other.

#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

Let us pray... Lord Jesus Christ, in the Sacrament of Holy Communion you give us your true body and blood as proof of your atoning sacrifice. Give us repentance and faith to receive the blessings of this Sacrament for our eternal good. You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

#### FIRST LESSON

#### Exodus 12:21-30

<sup>21</sup>Then Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go and take lambs for yourselves according to your family size, and slaughter the Passover lamb. <sup>22</sup>You shall take a bundle of hyssop, dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and paint the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood that is in the basin. None of you are to go out of the door of your house until morning. <sup>23</sup>When the LORD passes through to strike Egypt and sees the blood on the lintel and the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over that door and will not allow the destroyer to enter your houses to strike you.

<sup>24</sup>"You shall observe these instructions as a perpetual regulation for you and your descendants. <sup>25</sup>When you enter the land that the LORD will give you just as he said he would, you shall observe this ceremony. <sup>26</sup>So when your children ask you, 'What does this ceremony mean to you?' <sup>27</sup>you will say, 'It is the sacrifice of the Passover to the LORD, who passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt. When he struck the Egyptians, he spared our houses.'"

The people bowed down and worshipped. <sup>28</sup>The Israelites went and did all this. They did just as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron.


<sup>29</sup>At midnight the LORD struck down all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh, who sat on his throne, to the firstborn of the prisoner who was in the dungeon, even all the firstborn of the livestock. <sup>30</sup>During the night Pharaoh got up—he, all his servants, and all the Egyptians—and there was a loud outcry in Egypt, for there was not a house where there was not someone dead.



1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness,

#### but with the bread without yeast, the bread of sincerity and truth.

#### **GOSPEL LESSON**

<sup>12</sup>On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" <sup>13</sup>He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city, and there a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him. <sup>14</sup>Wherever he enters, tell the owner of the house that the Teacher says, 'Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' <sup>15</sup>He will show you a large upper room, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there."

<sup>16</sup>His disciples left and went into the city and found things just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

<sup>17</sup>When it was evening, he arrived with the Twelve.

<sup>18</sup>While they were reclining and eating, Jesus said, "Amen I tell you: One of you will betray me, one who is eating with me."

<sup>19</sup>They began to be sorrowful and said to him one by one, "Surely not I?"

<sup>20</sup>He said to them, "It is one of the Twelve, one who is dipping bread with me in the dish. <sup>21</sup>Indeed, the Son of Man is going to go just as it has been written about him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

<sup>22</sup>While they were eating, Jesus took bread. When he had blessed it, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "Take it. This is my body."

<sup>23</sup>Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them. They all drank from it. <sup>24</sup>He said to them, "This is my blood of the new testament, which is poured out for many. <sup>25</sup>Amen I tell you: I will certainly not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." <sup>26</sup>After they sang a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.




