WELCOME!

DARKNESS, SILENCE, SOUND

Tenebrae means "darkness" or "shadows." The quiet and symbolic nature of this service recalls the dread seriousness of our sin and the amazing heights of God's love. Just think how Jesus chose to suffer all this to save us! The extinguishing of the candles and progressive dimming of the lights recalls the darkness that covered the land while Jesus hung on the cross. The loud sound recalls the stone at Jesus' tomb. The candle returned and left burning anticipates Jesus' Resurrection on Easter.

Please note there will be a minimum of spoken instructions to highlight the solemnity of the day.

NO BLESSING TODAY

The typical blessing at the conclusion of the service is omitted, as today's service is considered part of one continuous observance of the culmination of our Savior's ministry which began Maundy Thursday and concludes with the blessing as we celebrate our Lord's Resurrection Easter Morning—6:00 am Sunrise Service, 8:00 & 10:30 am Festival Services.

There will NOT be a Monday service.



But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins


with his innocent suffering and death.

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
ABSOLUTION

Let us pray.





LESSON Isaiah 53:1–7

Who has believed our report, and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? ²He grew up before him like a tender shoot and like a root from dry ground. He had no attractiveness and no majesty. When we saw him, nothing about his appearance made us desire him. ³He was despised and rejected by men, a man who knew grief, who was well acquainted with suffering. Like someone whom people cannot bear to look at, he was despised, and we thought nothing of him. ⁴Surely he was taking up our weaknesses, and he was carrying our sufferings. We thought it was because of God that he was stricken, smitten, and afflicted, but it was because of our rebellion that he was pierced. He was crushed for the guilt our sins deserved. The punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. ⁶We all have gone astray like sheep. Each of us has turned to his own way, but the LORD has charged all our guilt to him. ⁷He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth. Like a lamb he was led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that is silent in front of its shearers,

he did not open his mouth.

²The Lord said to Satan, "The LORD rebuke you, Satan! The LORD, who has chosen Jerusalem, rebuke you! Isn't this man a burning stick plucked from a fire?"

³Now Joshua was clothed in filthy clothing and was standing in front of the Angel. ⁴Then the Angel of the LORD spoke to those who were standing in front of him: "Remove his filthy clothing."

Then he said to Joshua, "See, I have taken your guilt away from you, so that I may clothe you in a special robe."

⁵I said, "Let them place a clean turban on his head." So they placed a clean turban on his head and got him dressed, while the Angel of the LORD was standing by.

⁶Then the Angel of the LORD spoke solemnly to Joshua:

⁷This is what the LORD of Armies says. If you will walk in my ways and carry out my ministry, then you will also govern my house and watch over my courts, and I will give you access among those who are standing here.

On one stone with seven facets I will engrave an inscription, declares the LORD of Armies, and I will remove the guilt of this land in a single day.

¹⁰On that day, declares the LORD of Armies, each one of you will invite his neighbor to join him under his vine and under his fig tree.



LESSON *John 19:17-30*

¹⁷Carrying his own cross, he went out to what is called the Place of a Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. ¹⁸There they crucified him with two others, one on each side, and Jesus in the middle.

¹⁹Pilate also had a notice written and fastened on the cross. It read, "Jesus the Nazarene, the King of the Jews."

²⁰Many of the Jews read this notice, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, Latin, and Greek.

²¹So the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but that 'this man said, "I am the King of the Jews.""

²²Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written."

²³When the soldiers crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier. They also took his tunic, which was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom. ²⁴So they said to one another, "Let's not tear it. Instead, let's cast lots to see who gets it." This was so that the Scripture might be fulfilled which says:

They divided my garments among them

and cast lots for my clothing.

So the soldiers did these things.

²⁵Jesus' mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene were standing near the cross.

²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son!" ²⁷Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother!" And from that time this disciple took her into his own home.

²⁸After this, knowing that everything had now been finished, and to fulfill the Scripture, Jesus said, "I thirst."


²⁹A jar full of sour wine was sitting there. So they put a sponge soaked in sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to his mouth.

³⁰When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished!" Then, bowing his head, he gave up his spirit.



LESSON Hebrews 7:26-28

²⁶This is certainly the kind of high priest we needed: one who is holy, innocent, pure, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. ²⁷Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices on a daily basis, first for his own sins and then for the sins of the people. In fact, he sacrificed for sins once and for all when he offered himself. ²⁸For the law appoints as high priests men who have weaknesses. But the word of the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been brought to his goal forever.



⁵⁷When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who was also a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered that it be given to him. ⁵⁹Joseph took the body, wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, ⁶⁰and laid it in his own new tomb that he had cut in the rock. He rolled a large stone over the tomb's entrance and left. ⁶¹Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there sitting opposite the tomb.

⁶²On the next day, which was the day after the Preparation Day, the chief priests and Pharisees gathered in the presence of Pilate ⁶³and said, "Sir, we remembered what that deceiver said while he was still alive: 'After three days I will rise again.' ⁶⁴So give a command that the tomb be made secure until the third day. Otherwise his disciples might steal his body and tell the people, 'He is risen from the dead.' And this last deception will be worse than the first."

⁶⁵Pilate said to them, "You have a guard. Go, make it as secure as you know how." ⁶⁶So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and posting a guard.
