TODAY'S FOCUS

This Sunday we begin a five-Sunday stretch focusing on what is called Christ's "Bread of Life" sermon. (Another famous sermon by Jesus is His "Sermon on the Mount." You can read it in Matthew chapters 5-7.)

Today we won't hear any part of the "Bread of Life" sermon itself. Rather, we hear about the event that spawned the sermon: Jesus miraculously feeding the 5000.

The emphasis of today's Scripture readings are not merely the fact that God provides, but the *purpose* for which He provides and what He is able to do with our obedient use of His blessings *to carry out His Church's mission*.

To put it succinctly, God supplies us for stewardship.

THOUGH YOUR RICHES INCREASE, DO NOT SET YOUR HEART ON THEM

This reminder is given to us in the Psalm of the Day: Psalm 62. God does not give us money to *have*. He gives us money to *use* for serving Him while we are here on earth.
