NEW MISSION STATEMENT REVEAL – "FLOURISH"

"Peace Lutheran Ministries cultivates and nurtures faith to flourish in the peace of Christ."

Today is the third and final Sunday we are revealing / explaining the new mission statement of Peace Lutheran Ministries. It is a single mission statement with three distinct emphases. Today's emphasis is "flourish." This word aims at the spiritual well-being of our whole congregation.

BECAUSE LAST THURSDAY WAS THE 40TH DAY

The Bible tells us that 40 days after He rose from the dead Jesus bodily ascended into heaven in full view of His disciples (Acts 1:3, 9). Because of this the Christian Church celebrates the Ascension of Our Lord on the 40th day after Easter. The 40th day always falls on a Thursday. At Peace we observe the Ascension on the following Sunday (which is today). You'll notice one of the Scripture readings today speaks of Jesus' ascension into heaven.

FINAL SUNDAY

Today is the final Sunday of three in which we unveiled our new mission statement. Next Sunday we will celebrate the third major festival of the Christian Church Year (along with Christmas and Easter): The Festival of Holy Pentecost.

NEW HYMNS OF THE SERVICE

The hymn "This is the Feast" (CW#938) is being sung as a response to the absolution in place of the normal Gloria in Excelsis ("Glory Be to God on High"). It is an Easter hymn because we are still in the Season of Easter. Today is the last Sunday of the Easter Season.

The hymn "Christ the Vine" (CW#709) serves as the Hymn of the Day. The words were written by Michael Schultz and tie in with today's Gospel Lesson from John 15. Schultz, a WELS pastor, oversaw the entire project of publishing the blue hymnal we are now using called "Christian Worship" – a ten-year project! He graduated from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in 1989 and is now pastor of Faith Lutheran Church, Tallahassee, FL.

It is believed the melody (entitled "Salley Gardens") is an Irish tune connected with a poem written by William Butler Yeats in 1895. Yeats was attempting to reconstruct an old ballad which he learned from an old peasant woman in Ireland. She only knew broken parts of the song. The name of Yeats' poem is "Down by the Salley Gardens." Many versions of this song have been performed by musicians and vocalists to the present day.

FIRST READING Colossians 1:3-11a

³We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love that you have for all the saints ⁵because of the hope that is stored up for you in heaven. You have already heard about this in the word of truth, the gospel ⁶that is present with you now. The gospel is bearing fruit and growing in the entire world, just as it also has been doing among you from the day you heard it and came to know the grace of God in truth. ⁷You learned this from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf. ⁸He is the one who told us about your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, from the day we heard about your love, we also have not stopped praying for you. We keep asking that you would be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding, ¹⁰so that you might live in a way that is worthy of the Lord. Our goal is that you please him by bearing fruit in every kind of good work and by growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹as you are being strengthened with all power because of his glorious might working in you.

SECOND READING Acts 1:1-12

I wrote my first book, Theophilus, about everything Jesus began doing and teaching ²until the day he was taken up, after he had given instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³After he had suffered, he presented himself alive to the apostles with many convincing proofs. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and told them things about the kingdom of God.

⁴Once, when he was eating with them, he commanded them, "Do not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for what the Father promised, which you heard from me. ⁵For John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶So when they were together with him, they asked, "Lord, is this the time when you are going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

⁷He said to them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹After he said these things, he was taken up while they were watching, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰They were looking intently into the sky as he went away. Suddenly, two men in white clothes stood beside them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing here looking up into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

¹²Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mountain called the Mount of Olives, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away.

GOSPEL John 15:1-8

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ²Every branch in me that does not bear fruit, he is going to cut off. And he prunes every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will bear more fruit.

³"You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴Remain in me, and I am going to remain in you. A branch cannot bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Likewise, you cannot bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵"I am the Vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him is the one who bears much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. ⁶If anyone does not remain in me, he is thrown away like a branch and withers. Such branches are gathered, thrown into the

fire, and burned. ⁷If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸My Father is glorified by this: that you continue to bear much fruit and prove to be my disciples."
