THEME: THE KING IS COMING! WATCH!

Today is the first Sunday of the season we call Advent. The word Advent means "coming." Advent builds our anticipation for the coming of Christ – first, when He came as a baby in Bethlehem; secondly, the way He comes to us in Word and Sacrament right now; thirdly, when He will come visibly on the Last Day. The themes of the four Sundays of Advent are as follows:

Watch!

Prepare!

Rejoice!

Behold!

BLUE

Blue is the color of the skies. It is the color of hope. You'll notice the pastors' stoles are blue. This is the color of the season of Advent because we are hopeful and eager for the coming of Christ. His coming is a joyful, happy thing for us.

What does it mean when we pray, "Your Kingdom come?" Find out on page 289 of the blue hymnal. It is called the Second Petition.

WEDNESDAY ADVENT SERVICES

- We will worship on three Wednesdays (35 minute services) on December 4, 11, and 18 at 6:30 PM.
- There will be snacks & fellowship afterward.
- We will hear Scripture lessons pertaining to the birth & ministry of John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ. (These readings don't show up in the normal Sunday lectionary.)
- The offerings from these Wednesday services will support Institutional Ministries - a WELS affiliated ministry to prisons, long term care and mental health patients.
- The purpose of Wednesday Advent services is to take quiet time with the Word during the bustle of the season to prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of Christ.



and Jerusalem will dwell securely.


