THEME: THE KING IS COMING! BEHOLD!

Today is the fourth Sunday of the season we call Advent. The word Advent means "coming." Advent builds our anticipation for the coming of Christ – first, when He came as a baby in Bethlehem; secondly, the way He comes to us in Word and Sacrament right now; thirdly, when He will come visibly on the Last Day. The themes of the four Sundays of Advent are as follows:

Watch!

Prepare!

Rejoice!

Behold!

PLEASE RESPECT OUR PRACTICE OF "CLOSE COMMUNION"

Christ says the Sacrament is an expression of unity (1 Co 10:16-17). We WANT to be unified with you on the basis of Christ and His doctrine! Honesty compels us to ask you to WAIT before communing with us: 1) until you've had a chance to find out what we teach; 2) until you make your unity with us evident by membership at Peace. WHAT'S THE MEANING OF THE ADVENT WREATH?

The arrangement of four blue candles and one white candle in the front of the worship space is simply a tool for counting off the four Sundays of Advent. On Christmas Eve/Day the white candle is lit. It is a way to build anticipation for the celebration of Christ's birth.



in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God.


They will dwell securely, for at that time he will be great to the ends of the earth.



Brothers and sisters, go in peace. Live in harmony with one another. Serve the Lord with gladness.


